- A. Done on an extra credit basis only.

## 5. GRADING POLICY

- A. Students will earn a daily grade of up to 10 points for each day they attend class. Half the points are determined by the quality of the work done. The other half is determined by behavior.

## 6. GRADING SYSTEM

90-100 percent A

## 7. CREDIT SYSTEM

- A. One credit will be earned for every twelve productive days. Student must earn at least six points a day to be considered a productive day.

- B. Students can earn extra credit for work done out of class. The extra credit cannot exceed the amount of credit earned in class.

C. Students can earn a maximum of five credits each grading period. On the average the grading period is thirty school days.

D. A student who earns an F will receive no credit.

## 1. GRADING POLICY

## 2. GRADING SYSTEM 90-100 percent A 80-90 percent B 75-80 percent C 70- 75 percent D 0-69 percent F

## 3. CREDIT SYSTEM

- A. One credit will be earned for every 12 productive days. A student must earn at least six points a day to be considered a productive day.
- B. Students can earn extra credit for written work done outside class. Extra credit cannot exceed the amount of credit earned in class.
- C. Students can earn a maximum of five credits each grading period. On the average the grading period is thirty days.
